

The WJCC Scholarship Fund of the Williamsburg Community Foundation provides scholarships for students graduating from Jamestown, Lafayette, and Warhill High Schools. The Fund is a community-wide effort to recognize the accomplishments of our students as they graduate from high school and support their further educational achievements. General and "Named Scholarships" are awarded, with their specific requirements listed below:

- <u>General Scholarship Fund</u> criteria include class rank, difficulty of curriculum, essay, activities and financial need; for seniors from any WJCC High School.
- <u>Eloise Agee Honorary Scholarship</u> for a senior graduating from a WJCC High School who attended Norge or Clara Byrd Baker Elementary Schools.
- **Joann Bierenbaum Memorial Scholarship** awarded to an especially caring student who shows academic promise and financial need.
- *Henry S. Branscome, Sr. Memorial Scholarship* for a Warhill High School student in good academic standing.
- <u>*Colonial Williamsburg Foundation Scholarship*</u> current or former foundation employees, volunteers, or their children; one scholarship at each high school.
- *Julia Everts Memorial Scholarship* for a student studying in the health related field with a preference for nursing (LPN or RN programs).
- **<u>Community Service Scholarship</u>** for a student who has demonstrated outstanding service to school/community and shows interest in continuing a record of service.
- **<u>Ray Freed Memorial Scholarship</u>** awarded to a student with a strong social studies background and interest in the field.
- <u>Friends of Green Spring Scholarship</u> for a Jamestown HS student in good academic standing, with preference to a student with membership in Rho Kappa or the Environthon Club and showing interest in archeology, history, architecture, cultural studies, or environmental studies.
- **<u>Robert E. Kiley Family Scholarship</u>** for a deserving student.
- Kiwanis Club of the Colonial Capital Scholarship for a deserving student.
- *Charles H. Koch, Jr. Memorial Scholarship* for students interested in legal careers and possibly criminal justice.
- <u>Retired LTC Stuart A. MacKenzie, Jr. Scholarship</u> Must hold a GPA of at least 3.0 or its equivalent; demonstrate a love of history through credits on transcripts or equivalent; demonstrate making significant public service contribution to their community through volunteering or community service hours during high school. Priority will be given to students of military families and those showing financial need.
- <u>O'Hare Scholarship: Geoffrey H. Boerner Memorial Scholarship</u> Warhill High School student with strong academic credentials.
- <u>O'Hare Scholarship: Kathleen O'Hare Doster Memorial Scholarship</u> Jamestown High School student with strong academic credentials.
- <u>O'Hare Scholarship: Margaret Karene O'Hare Memorial Scholarship</u> Lafayette High School student with strong academic credentials.

- <u>Nick Paszkiewicz (class of 2008) Memorial Scholarship</u> Jamestown student who demonstrates fine character, pride in academic achievement, and financial need; prefer Eagle Scout.
- <u>Performing Arts Scholarship</u>
- **<u>PTSA Scholarship: Jamestown High School</u>** offered to a Jamestown High School senior who has shown significant academic improvement over the course of their high school career, with a minimum GPA of 2.5 preferred at the time of selection. Well-rounded student involved in extracurricular activities also preferred.
- **PTSA Scholarship: Lafayette High School** for Lafayette High School students only.
- **<u>PTSA Scholarship: Warhill High School</u>** for Warhill High School students only.
- **<u>Charles and Heather Rawson Memorial Scholarship</u>** for a student in good academic standing who will be attending a Virginia public college or university.
- <u>*Riverside Doctors' Hospital Williamsburg*</u> For a student in good academic standing planning to pursue a career in health services, with preference given to a student demonstrating financial need.
- <u>Rose P. Rose Memorial Scholarship</u> Awarded to a student in high academic standing in the most advanced classes, especially Honors English 11. Strong preference given to a female student at Lafayette High School.
- <u>Andrea Sartain Memorial Scholarship</u> Warhill High School student who has actively participated in the visual arts program and plans to major in art; preferably interested in an art education career.
- <u>Wilma Register Sharp Scholarship</u> For a senior who will be attending Longwood University; must have an unweighted minimum GPA of 3.5 and minimum SAT of 1200. The student must show evidence of a rigorous course load and leadership in extracurricular activities.
- *Swain Family Basketball High Scholastic Achievement Scholarship* for a male student who shows the ability and dedication to be a high academic achiever while making the sacrifices and time commitment to play on the varsity basketball team. Recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.5 at one of the WJCC High Schools.
- <u>Swain Family Engineering Scholarship</u> For a senior student from any WJCC high school with a minimum GPA of 3.5 pursuing a degree in chemical engineering, mechanical engineering, nuclear engineering or aeronautical engineering.
- <u>Trevor Times Memorial Scholarship</u> To a student from Jamestown High School who exhibits the characteristics that made Trevor special: kindness, generosity of spirit, a sense of inclusiveness, a sense of humor, and dedication to studies.
- <u>Amy and Mike Watson 'Workforce Credentials' Scholarship</u> Awarded to a student who plans on attending a Virginia Community College, Trade School or Technical College, pursuing a highdemand or in-demand STEM or health care related industry recognized certification or associates degree (all industrial trades included). Minimum 3.0 GPA, and demonstrated financial need.
- **<u>Bette Williams Memorial Birthday Scholarship</u>** Promising female Lafayette High School student whose class rank is #20 or below.
- *Women's Club of Toano Scholarship* Promising female student who attended Toano Middle School.
- <u>Ann and James Yankovich Memorial Scholarship</u> for a student who has demonstrated leadership in school/community; is interested in education as a field of study and/or career goal; prefer first generation college student.
