2015 was another exciting year for the Williamsburg Community Foundation. We now have more families supporting the Foundation than ever before.

Because of your support, the Foundation awarded nearly \$700,000 in grants and scholarships to non-profits and graduating high school students. This past year we reached \$4 million in endowment assets, which provide the source of the competitive grants WCF distributes to local charities like the James River Association and the Williamsburg Symphony Orchestra, which you will read more about on pages 3 and 12 in this report.

After months of planning, we worked with An Occasion for the Arts to establish an endowment that will award grants to non-profits and local schools to support young artists in our area. In November, the Foundation's first agency endowment fund was established by Avalon: A Center for Women and Children, to support their work empowering and equipping survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence.

In June, the board completed a strategic planning process that has set our direction for the next four years and has helped us develop strong goals for

the Foundation's organizational development and to increase the vital role we intend to play in our community. The Foundation developed the VISION 2020 initiative with the goals of increasing the number of families supporting greater Williamsburg through the Foundation, providing greater connection to our local non-profits for our donors, and increasing the pool of philanthropic capital available to the community by encouraging legacy giving.

It has been a privilege to serve as board chair of the Williamsburg Community Foundation. We are very pleased to have Paul Gerhardt stepping up to lead the board over the next two years. Thankfully, the Foundation still has a job for me – along with my father, Robert Beck, we will be chairing the VISION 2020 initiative. I hope you will join us in advancing our vision for a more dynamic Williamsburg.

GRANTEE PROFILE

JAMES RIVER ASSOCIATION

Remember your first biology class in high school? Now imagine you are taking that same biology class while on a boat in the James River, and the class includes a campout on a national wildlife refuge.

It's that hands-on, experiential learning that the James River Association (JRA) provides through its James River Ecology School, which is the only one of its kind throughout the 550 national wildlife refuges around the country. The program connects youth with river-based learning experiences that inspire confidence, ecological understanding, nature appreciation, and conservation action. With support from the Williamsburg Community Foundation, JRA was able to bring almost 50 biology and ecology students from Jamestown and Lafayette High Schools to experience the James River School in October of 2015.

Lead Educator Kyle Burnett explained what the students experienced: "We started the trip by going upriver past Hopewell, where we talked about the Kepone Disaster, when the governor shut down the river for 13 years. This gets the kids thinking critically about the watershed and our natural resources." Located on an island in the middle of the James, the Presquile National Wildlife Refuge is a complete outdoor classroom. Students learn about sustainable fishing and biodiversity by pulling in a net and identifying the fish; about "green" structures like the bunkhouse where they sleep; and about pollutants by working in pairs to test the water quality.

"The thing that struck me the most was how many students have lived by the water their whole lives but have never touched a fish, or even been on a boat" said Bonnie Ellis, Coordinator of Science for W-JCC Schools, who participated in the Ecology School trips. "We teach about the Chesapeake Bay in the classroom but until the students are submersed in it, it's just words on a page...this makes it real for them. Once they were on the island and away from technology and other distractions, they had a chance to reflect on how their actions impact the Bay and I think it really hit home for some of them. They started asking questions and making connections that they would not have made if they did not have this experience."

This grant falls within Williamsburg Community
Foundation's area of interest of supporting children
and young adults. Our vision is that children
in Williamsburg will enter school ready to learn,
educational enrichment opportunities will be
available and affordable, and young adults will have
opportunities for volunteering and employment
in our community.

DONOR PROFILE

ART WALKER AND THE JOHN D. WALKER MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT FUND

In 1992, Art Walker was the Director of Rehabilitation Services at Cumberland Hospital for Children & Adolescents in New Kent, Virginia, when two nurses approached him about setting up a therapeutic horseback riding program. With the hospital's initial administrative support, a small abandoned stable on the hospital's grounds was resuscitated, and began what would become known as "Dream Catchers."

Now part of Cori Sikich Therapeutic Riding Center, Dream Catchers has grown and become established through further generosity of scores of individuals, families, and some thoughtful local businesses. Being a 501(c)(3) non-profit since 1993, the Center has benefited also from hundreds of very hard-working and loyal volunteers. "They're priceless," says Art.

"It provides a win-win for families and riders, and the horses, who are well-cared for and loved by all," says Art. "It's amazing to see the kids with these 1,200-pound animals! There's a natural affinity, much like children and dogs, yet different. They learn about horses, their care and feeding, how to act around one, what not to do, etc." There are also some seasoned riders, those with early Alzheimer's, or wounded veterans, who benefit from this professionally-supervised, nationally accredited program.

As Dream Catchers started to grow and stand on its own, Art asked family and friends to support the effort. John, his only sibling and younger brother, was a consistent and faithful contributor over the years. "He always gave when asked and never hesitated," Art remembers. An electrical engineer by trade, John retired from Bell Labs in New Jersey, moving to Florida in 2000. Whenever John visited his brother in Richmond, he would go down to the stable to visit with staff and watch a lesson. "People got to know him a bit," Art said. "I'm so glad John got to see the Center grow over time, and how it became one of the finest on the East Coast."

When John passed away suddenly in May, 2014, at age 64, he left his estate to Art and a cousin. "I wanted to use part of that as a tribute to my brother in a way that would grow, and last. In this way it would keep John's memory alive, and be a legacy that would last as long as the Center is there. This type of endowment builds a base into the program, and allows staff to focus on raising funds for general operations and direct services." Dream Catchers referred Art to the Williamsburg Community Foundation, and he established the John D. Walker Memorial Endowment Fund. The Fund provides annual disbursements to Dream Catchers to support staff training, which is critical to keeping the Center accredited – and insured.

Over the years Dream Catchers has worked to improve the quality of life for individuals with physical, emotional, and developmental needs, serving riders from all over central Virginia. The program has had a significant impact on children with autism, as demonstrated by a recent study done in partnership with the College of William and Mary. "We were very different in several respects," Art said of his brother. "I was in a helping profession, while he was always more technically inclined. John liked to restore old radios from the late twenties to the early sixties. He didn't give to many charities, but Dream Catchers was one of them. I think it's those who contribute consistently that make the biggest difference, similar to those who volunteer week in and week out."

TYPES OF FUNDS

COMMUNITY ENDOWMENT FUNDS

Unrestricted endowment gifts to the WCF are placed in the Community Endowment, which the Board of Trustees uses to address the changing needs of greater Williamsburg through a competitive process.

FIELD-OF-INTEREST FUNDS

A Field-of-Interest Fund allows a donor to select a particular area for grantmaking. Grant recipients will be selected through a competitive process.

DESIGNATED AND AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS

A Designated Fund allows the donor to select one or more specific charities to receive grants from the fund when the fund is established. Non-profit organizations may establish an Agency Endowment Fund to support their work.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Scholarship Funds may be established to support local students or to provide scholarships at a particular educational institution.

The funds raised at Williamsburg's 300th Anniversary Gala Celebration – a gift of \$40,000 - became the core of what is now WCF's Community Endowment.




GRANTEE PROFILE

THE WILLIAMSBURG SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

With support from the Williamsburg Community Foundation, the Williamsburg Symphony Orchestra presented *Carnival of the Animals*, an affordable community concert targeted specifically to families that introduced children to music using playful repertoire, dancers, and an artist. The hour-long program was held on May 21, 2016, at the Williamsburg Community Chapel. The Symphony's music director Janna Hymes conducted the concert.

"For young children, learning is experiential and multi-sensory," says Symphony Executive Director Carolyn Keurajian. "We were excited to partner with Adelle Carpenter from the Virginia Regional Ballet, who provided dancers for two of the pieces." In addition, children got the opportunity to play the violin, cello, woodwind, or brass instruments during a demonstration time after the show.

The program featured *Carnival* of the *Animals*, a children's classic with 14 movements, each one representing a different animal – a lion, a donkey, an elephant, as well as fossils, an aquarium, and an aviary. Pictures of the animals drawn by an artist were projected behind the orchestra so children could



associate the musical sounds with a particular animal.

Carnival of the Animals allowed families the opportunity to spend quality time together and share in the excitement of live music performed by a symphony orchestra. The program was offered at no charge to active military families and participants of the Armed Forces Music Partnership.

The Williamsburg Symphonia has been a staple in the community arts scene for over 32 years. Under the direction of Janna Hymes, the orchestra has received critical acclaim for its outstanding classical, pops, and educational programs. In April, the orchestra announced a name change to more clearly reflect what the orchestra is today: The Williamsburg Symphony Orchestra.

This program falls within the Foundation's newly revised category of Arts and Culture. Arts and Culture is focused on bringing the arts to a wider audience in our community by supporting performances, public art, and increased access to the arts for all citizens.




