## Housing & Economic Mobility Fund Launches to Support Local ALICE Families

On September 18, more than 100 guests joined us at The Art Museums of Colonial Williamsburg to help launch a new fund to support Housing & Economic Mobility in Williamsburg, James City County, and York County.

Economic mobility is the ability for people to move up the economic ladder to build stability, create opportunity, and ensure each generation has a stronger foundation than the one before. This includes support for ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) families—those who work hard but still struggle to get ahead.

Grants from this new fund will be awarded to organizations that help our neighbors move from subsistence to prosperity.

Areas of support include access to safe, affordable housing; transportation; adult education; financial literacy; and meeting families' financial needs.

The evening also included the **Founders Award for Vision and Excellence**, awarded this year to Linda T. Baker and John R. Curtis, Jr. They each were selected for their contributions to the community, as well as their thoughtful leadership and dedication to WCF from its earliest days.

### New Fund Will Help Improve WATA Bus Stops

For many local residents, the bus is more than transportation—it's a lifeline to work, school, and community.

"We know that something as simple as better lighting or a shelter can change how people use public transit," said Matthew Scalia, executive director of WATA. This fund may also provide grants to nonprofit or governmental organizations to purchase WATA bus passes for individuals and families in need.

## Your Gifts At Work in Our Community: \$131,532 in Fall Grants

The Williamsburg Community Foundation has awarded \$131,532 in grants to 31 local nonprofits as part of its fall grant cycle, the largest amount ever awarded in a single grant round in the Foundation's history.

This record-setting investment was made possible in part by gifts to the Foundation's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Campaign, which focused last year on growing the community endowment and field-of-interest funds in order to grow the Foundation's annual support for nonprofits serving Williamsburg, James City County, and York County.

In this latest grant round, awards were made in the Community Foundation's six focus areas:

**Arts & Culture:** Two grants totaling \$10,000, including Virginia Organizing who will provide simultaneous interpretation at Williamsburg Pride and chapter meetings to ensure Spanish-speaking residents can take part fully.

**Children & Young Adults:** Twelve grants totaling \$44,379, including The Friends of Foster Care (below left), which provides in-home academic tutoring for foster youth and those recently transitioned from care.

Housing & Economic Mobility: Two grants totaling \$7,500, including NATASHA House, Inc., which will deliver trauma-informed services through its HOME program, preparing mothers for homeownership and long-term family stability.

**Environment & Conservation:** One grant of \$5,000 to Williamsburg Community Growers (below center) to prepare new plots with enriched soil and irrigation to expand its community gardening program.

**Health & Wellness:** Eleven grants totaling \$49,653, including a grant to Olde Towne Medical and Dental Center (*below right*) to buy new EKG and urinalysis equipment to meet increasing demand from uninsured and underinsured patients.

**Senior Services:** Three grants totaling \$15,000, including Faith in Action Williamsburg, which provides volunteer-driven services, including transportation to medical appointments, food delivery, and in-home assistance, that help older adults remain independent.
